The firm won a Contract World Award 2008 for their first realized project, a restaurant built for Autostadt, the theme park and communications platform for the Volkswagen Group in Wolfsburg. Recently, the firm also won 1st prizes to design a new private airport in St. Moritz-Samedan in Switzerland, and a masterplan for the redevelopment of 230 ha in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Markus Schaefer has a Masters in Architecture from Harvard University and a Masters in Biology from the University of Zürich.
